

Our Guest Speaker

Robert E. Davies was born and educated in Mt. Forest, Ont. In his final year at high school he was called upon to take over the family retail business owing to the sudden death of his father.

He has been very active in his church, Mt. Forest United. He has helped with many community projects having served as a director of the Mt. Forest Boy Scout Group and as a director of the Louise Marshall hospital board. He is a former member of the Cameron Highlanders Pipe band.

His hobbies include all sports and he is the holder of an Advanced Amateur radio license and can be identified all over the world by the call letters VE3 ERD.

In 1960 he was the Worshipful Master of his mother lodge, St. Albans No. 200 and he was elected District Deputy Grand Master of Grey district in 1961.

He was appointed a member of the Board of General Purposes of Grand Lodge in 1964 and subsequently elected to 5 successive two year terms. In 1975 he was elected Deputy Grand Master and in July 1977, he became the 58th Grand Master in our 122 year history.



During his term as Grand Master he attended the Grand Communications of Grand Lodges in England, Israel, the Netherlands, and many states in the United States.

He served on various committees of the Conference of Grand Masters of Masons in North America and the Conference of Grand Secretaries in North America.

He was the prime moving force behind the project HELP, (hearing for every living person). This program exceeded its target of \$350,000 for research into hearing problems by \$150,000.

As Grand Master he also saw the need for and appointed a long range planning committee.

Our past Grand Master and Grand Secretary has been active in other Masonic bodies. He is a member of the Guelph Valley of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite and Moore Sovereign Consistory having served as Most Wise Soverign of the Guelph chapter of Rose Croix. He was coroneted an Honorary Inspector General, 33rd degree, Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite in 1977. He is a member of the Mocha Temple, Ancient order, Nobles of the Mystic Shrine, and the Royal Order of Scotland.

In 1961, Robert E. Davies was the youngest District Deputy Grand Master in the jurisdiction and at the age of 45 was one of the youngest men ever to be elected Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Canada in the Province of Ontario.

In September, 1979, following the resignation of Most Wor. Bro. John A. Irvine, he was appointed to the office of Grand Secretary, in which capacity he presently serves with distinction.

He is currently the treasurer of the Biennial Conference of Canadian Grand and District Grand Lodges, an association that represents Masonry in all Canadian provinces. He has also been a member of several committees of that body.

Ashlar Lodge is truly honored on its 60th anniversary by having as our speaker, Most. Wor. Bro. Robert E. Davies.

Sixty Years at Ashlar Lodge No.610 G.R.C.

- 31 Masons were charter members on institution night, June 26, 1922. (none survive in 1982)
- 51 candidates were initiated during the 13 regular and 18 emergent meetings held in the 14 months the lodge was under dispensation.
- Ashlar Lodge No. 610 G.R.C. was constituted on September 10, 1923, by the Grand Master, Most Wor. Bro. W.J. Drope.

The Early Years

- Many of the early members were staff or patients from the nearby Queen Alexandra Sanatorium.
- The old Byron town hall was purchased for \$1,000 in 1925
- A contribution was made to the Benevolent Fund at the Sanatorium in 1924 and has been made to the same fund every year since. (now the Christmas Seal Fund)
- Ashlar was the youngest lodge of the 24 in the London district following Temple 597 and until 1955 when Centennial No. 684 was formed.

Depression and War Years

- Membership dropped from 101 to 97 in 1931.
- Not one application for membership was received in 1936 for the first time since Ashlar's inception.
- Wor. Bro. Fred Fuller was elected District Deputy Grand Master of the London District in 1935 and Wor. Bro. Eli Davis was appointed a Grand Steward in 1936. (Ashlar's first gold braid)
- Ashlar's building was used for many community projects.
- The dues of all Brethren serving in the armed forces were remitted for the duration of the war.
- Ashlar held a thanksgiving service for victory in Europe on May 16, 1945.

Post War Years

- Membership soared following World War II and reached a peak of 195 in 1963. (1982 membership is 174)
- Ashlar had a close association with Henderson Lodge No. 388 in Ilderton for some 10 years - Henderson used Ashlar's temple after theirs was destroyed by fire and Ashlar used Henderson's while building its new temple. Joint installations were enjoyed.

New Building

- The lodge accepted a proposal by several Ashlar members and some outsiders to build a new lodge building for the lodge in return for a 50 year lease on the downstairs facility.
- Ashlar spent \$6,200 furnishing the new lodge room.
- The new building was dedicated by Grand Lodge on June 26, 1956.
- Dues were increased from \$5 to \$8 per year in 1957. (the first increase since Ashlar's inception.)

The Sixties

- Wor. Bro. Ross Fuller was elected District Deputy Grand Master of the London district in 1961 and Wor. Bro. Rolfe Weekes was appointed a Grand Sword Bearer in 1962.
- Rt. Wor. Bro. Fuller was appointed to the Board of General Purposes of Grand Lodge for a two year term in 1963 and was elected to two more terms to July, 1969.

Wor. Bro. Hector McKillop, an Ashlar member, was elected District Deputy Grand Master of Hamilton "A" district in 1963.

Rt. Wor. Bro. McKillop was Worshipful Master of Oakville Lodge No. 400 in 1952 and affiliated with Claude M. Kent Lodge No. 681 in Oakville but always kept his membership in Ashlar.

In 1981 Ashlar was pleased to present Rt. Wor. Bro. McKillop with his 50 year pin.

London district was divided into London West and London East districts in 1966. (Ashlar was placed in London West)

Wor. Bro. Robert R. Preston, secretary of Ashlar in 1967, was appoint-

ed a Grand Steward.

Ashlar supported the formation of Oakridge Lodge No. 708 in 1962 by renting its temple to the new lodge. Several Ashlar members are members of Oakridge.

In 1969, Rt. Wor. Bro. Fuller was appointed the representative of the

Grand Lodge of Colorado near our Grand Lodge..

50th Anniversary

Ashlar's 50th anniversary was celebrated in 1972.

The speaker for the anniversary banquet was Rt. Wor. Wilfred E. Adams, Deputy Grand Master, Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons, of the State of Michigan.

The 50th anniversary project enlarged and renovated the ante room.

Four Ashlar members received 50 year pins:

Ver. Wor. Bro. Eli Davis Wor. Bro. N.T. Sanderson

Wor. Bro. Trevor Meriam Bro. Col. Thomas Sanderson

Ashlar member, Wor. Bro. W.P. Simpson, was recognized for 60 years service to Masonry.

The Seventies and Eighties

Wor. Bro. R.D. Palser was elected District Deputy Grand Master of the London West district in 1972 and Wor. Bro. Leroy Noble was appointed a Grand Steward the following year.

Ver. Wor. Bro. Leroy Noble was elected secretary of the lodge succeeding Wor. Bro. Harry Unwin who resigned in December, 1974.

- Ashlar won the Maurice Roberts blood donors trophy in 1974 and 1978. (the trophy was named in memory of Wor. Bro. Maurice Roberts, who was Worshipful Master of Ashlar in 1967.)
- Ver. Wor. Bro. Eli Davis, one of Ashlar's first members and a faithful attender for all of Ashlar's history, died in 1976.

In 1976, Wor. Bro. R.J. Sanderson, a member of Ashlar, was appointed a Grand Steward in Oakridge Lodge No. 708.

- Wor. Bro. W. Percy Simpson, a member of Ashlar for 48 years, died in 1977 at the age of 95. A 70 year pin had been presented to him in
- The lodge studied and agreed to proposals by developers to sell our building and move to other premises but the developers were unable to carry out their plans.

Many improvements were made to our lodge building during the latter part of the seventies - Wor. Bros. Stan Norris, Wm. Phillips, Robert Soper, and Bro. Henry Muirhead made substantial contributions.

Dues were increased from \$12 to \$15 in January, 1976, and in December that same year they were raised to \$20. Three years later it was necessary to raise them again to \$30.

- A bequest of \$2,000 was received from the estate of Wor. Bro. Geo. Harris who was Worshipful Master in 1946.
- The June meeting was abolished in 1978 at the suggestion of Grand Lodge.
- Mrs. Grace Wickerson, widow of Wor. Bro. Geo. Wickerson, who was Worshipful Master in 1935 and who died in 1978, gave the lodge two cheques totalling \$1,200 in memory of her husband.
- A donation of \$80 for lodge projects was given to the lodge by the family of Bro. Bert Foyston who died in 1980.
- Wor. Bro. C.F. Cappa, a member of Ashlar and a past master of Oakridge Lodge No. 708, was elected District Deputy Grand Master of the London West District for 1981-82 representing Oakridge.
- Wor. Bro. Wm. Macrow was elected secretary of the lodge in December, 1981.
- Ashlar made plans for celebrating its 60th anniversary by appointing an anniversary committee of all past masters and the 1982 officers.
- Wor. Bro. Harry Unwin was appointed a Grand Steward in July 1982.
